

LSUHSC's Tilton selected for prestigious honor

The Child Neurology Society chose Dr. Ann Tilton, LSUHSC Clinical Professor of Neurology, as the recipient of the 2012 Hower Award. This award, given to only one child neurologist each year, honors an outstanding teacher and scholar whose contributions to the specialty have been recognized at national and international levels.



Dr. Tilton joined the LSUHSC faculty in 1985. The American Academy of Neurology named her Vice-Chair of the Child Section in 2011. She is on the Research Review Committee of the NIH Study Section that constitutes the national task force on motor disorders in childhood and has participated in grant reviews on similar subjects for South Africa. Dr. Tilton served on the Residency Review Committee for Neurology of the ACGME for seven years, and as Vice-Chair for three. She has served as an oral examiner for part II of the ABPN, as Neurology Director since 2008.

The AmeriHealth Mercy Family of Companies (AMFC) funded the \$100,000 endowed professorship after Dr. Peggy Honoré, Associate Professor of Public Health, approached them with the opportunity.
