- I. Welcome
 - 1. President Farrar welcomed everyone to the meeting
- II. Approval of December meeting minutes
 - 1. The minutes were approved with one amendment to the SACS response: We will have to submit monitoring reports to provide data that we are to be collecting for 3.3.1.2 (Administrative Support Services) and 3.3.1.3 (Student Support Services)
- III. President's Report/Meeting with Vice Chancellor Moerschbaecher
 - 1. E-mail recently distributed regarding PM-11
 - a. As a result of a recent audit, it was recommended that we needed to have more explicit instructions with regards to outside employment
 - b. There is also a dedicated area on the Academic Affairs site for this issue
 - 2. Hoda Kotb lecture on January 17th
 - a. It is not open to the public but is for all faculty, students, and staff of the HSC
 - b. Attendees will receive a copy of her book
 - 3. Dr. Rebekah Gee

- a. As the new secretary of DHH, she has issued a call for public servants to help improve Medicaid
- 4. Banners are now on display at the Dental School on the fence and surrounding utility poles
- 5. Parking at the Dental School
 - a. The construction of the new building is affecting the faculty/staff/student parking areas as there is now only one way in and out, but there is a possibility they will open another gate to help ease some of the problems
 - b. Also adding to this issue is the closure/demolition of the Wisner bridge over I-610; traffic has increased greatly with drivers having to find new ways around the area
- 6. A new space for group teaching activities has not been identified as of yet
- 7. Campus security
 - a. The two recent purse snatchings occurred outside of the Human Development Center and by one of the student lots on Prieur
 - i. University Police have pictures of the perpetrator; he was sitting on the steps outside of the Trail Building and has an expensive bike that should be easy to identify
 - ii. NOPD has been on campus and were likely to send a detective to investigate
 - iii. The two students were new to the Physician Assistants program
 - a. One was unaware they were unable to enter the buildings
 - b. Their orientation occurs approximately 10 days after they start classes; Dean Cairo will be asked about the possibility of changing the time of the orientation so that students can be better informed about campus issues
 - b. Hiring of 14 new University Police officers
 - i. Four are to start during the next week, with two requiring completion of their marksman certification
 - ii. Seven others are currently going through the academy
 - c. Officers stationed on Tulane
 - i. A University Police officer is now at the corner of Tulane and Bolivar starting at 4:30 a.m.
 - ii. UMC also has an officer stationed across the street
- 8. Heart Health Month in February
 - a. Angela Amedee is coordinating various activities and President Farrar is the contact for the Dental School
 - b. February 5th is Wear Red Day
 - c. Nursing will hold a mini heart health fair
 - d. Dr. Subramaniam will hold a seminar on women's heart health February 26th in the HDC
- 9. State budget deficit
 - a. A special session will be held in three weeks
 - b. There will definitely need to be belt-tightening especially since the budget cuts will be compressed into the final quarter of the fiscal year

- c. Some systems may furlough faculty and staff
- 10. New Vice Chancellor for Community and Multicultural Affairs
 - a. Former senator Ed Murray starts this week
 - b. The position was previously held by the late Ron Gardner

11. Louisiana Research Summit

- a. The summit is scheduled for February 16th at the HDC
- b. The agenda for the meeting was distributed to the Senate via e-mail

IV. New Business

- 1. Review of IPE faculty survey
 - a. Tina Gunaldo, Director of the Center for Interprofessional Education and Collaborative Practice, requested the Senate's input on a survey she would like to distribute to evaluate faculty attitudes to IPE activities
 - b. The Senate unanimously approved the survey
- 2. Recently-acquired land and buildings
 - a. Senator Delacroix suggested the possibility of using one of the newly-acquired buildings or the 1542 building to supplement security on campus
 - b. The Executive Committee will discuss the issue with Dr. Moerschbaecher at their next meeting and also pursue broaching the issue with Vice Chancellor Murray
