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
IPSA LEADERSHIP AWARD APPLICATIONS

Hours will not be considered beyond this deadline without prior approval from the IPSA Board. If there are discrepancies in your submitted hours, you will be required to contact the program directly. Confirmation of the correct hours can then be forwarded to Katherine Hammer at khamm2@lsuhsc.edu. Hours received prior to fall 2015 cannot be verified as many program leaders have since graduated. Please be respectful when inquiring about hours, and plan accordingly.
