It has come to the attention of the IPSA Board that many students sign up for events or workshops, and fail to attend. The recent attrition rate has made planning and organizing events difficult for program leaders. Unanticipated absences results in wasted time, supplies, and funds of our programs. IPSA does not currently maintain a policy regarding unexcused absences from students who sign up for events, but in light of the continued complaints and wasted resources, we have begun to explore the possibility of repercussions for repeated offenses. Failure to attend events for which you have signed up is considered to be unprofessional, and going forward members will be asked to give at least 24 hours' notice if they are unable to attend. Emergency or extenuating circumstances will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

New Orleans Boulder Lounge at 2360 St. Claude St is hosts an LGBTQ night every month and allows for a portion of the proceeds to be donated to charity. This month's rock climbing event will be held on March 17 from 7pm-10pm. There is no minimum donation, however the cost to rent climbing shoes (if you don't bring your own) is \$4. Once the cost for your shoe rental is covered, extra funds will be donated to BreakOUT. For example, if you pay \$10 to climb, \$4 will be for the shoe rental and \$6 will be put towards the donation. BreakOUT is a local organization dedicated to ending the criminalization of LGBTO+ youth in New Orleans through youth organizing, healing justice, and leadership development programs.
