



Dr. Steve Nelson is the co-principal investigator of the highest ranked and highest funded grant. The \$5.9 million Clinical and Translational Research Education and Commercialization Program at LSU Health

Sciences Center and Tulane will support clinical and translational research. The clinical core will comprise the General Clinical Research Center (GCRC) housed at University Hospital which Dr. Nelson leads as Program Director.
