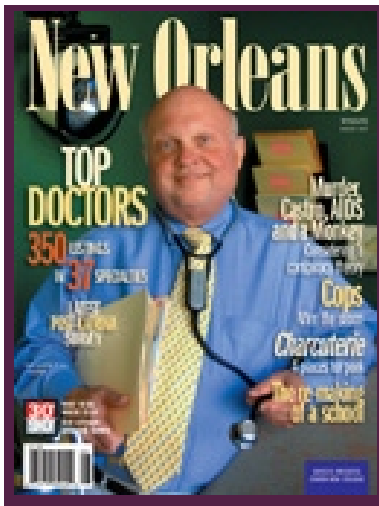

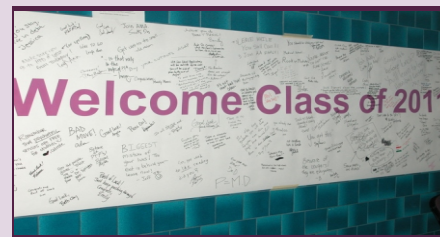
## Another school year underway

Registration and orientation for the School of Graduate Studies and the School of Public Health will be next Monday. The School of Allied Health Professions will follow on



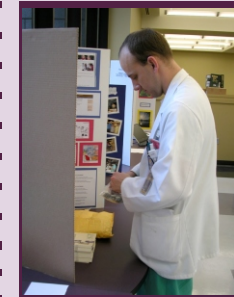
