While the finding that mental health is very important to people here is not surprising,



the results revealed some other interesting information as well. There were only two institutions mentioned by name, unprompted, in the list of those acknowledged as helping to improve health conditions since the hurricanes - LSU Medical Center and Ochsner. In the poll, 93% said medical and health research is important to the state's economy, and 97% said it is important for Louisiana to be a leader in medical and health research.

A number of our faculty and leaders participated. Dr. Mark Towsend was a panelist. Drs. Elizabeth Fontham, Howard Osofsky, Leonard Jack, and Nancy Buccola and Donna Williams also participated.




