

Patent issued on compound inhibiting cancer and other diseases

r. Eugene Woltering, Professor of Surgery, has been awarded a US Patent for a compound to inhibit the formation of blood vessels critical to the growth of cancerous tumors and diseases like diabetic retinopathy, obesity, and psoriasis. Apolioprotien A-1, the major protein component of lipoproteins, can be used to destroy existing blood vessels as well as prevent the development of new vessels.


