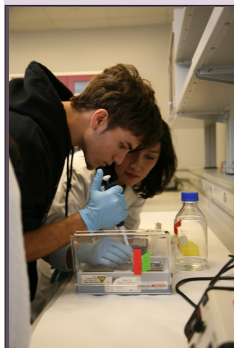
Ascension gifted students get hands-on experience

They began in the Clinical Skills Lab with Daryl Lofaso who taught them breath and heart sounds – the same material that first-year medical students learn. Then it was off to the Klein Center for Advanced Practice
