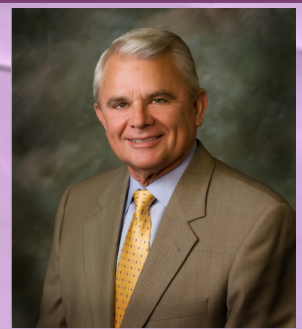

## Nutrition professor/author provides food for thought

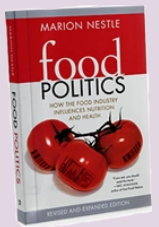
The School of Public Health partnered with marketumbrella.org to bring world renowned food expert Dr. Marion Nestle to LSUHSC.
