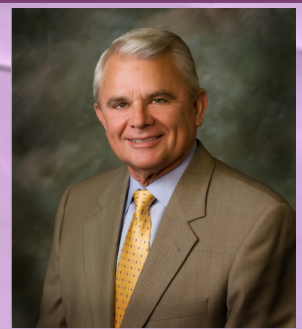

Andrieu installed as ADEA president

Dental school professor and Associate Dean Dr. Sandra Andrieu was installed as President of the American Dental Education Association at its annual meeting in Washington, DC. She was elected and served as President-elect last year.



As the sole national organization representing academic dentistry, the American Dental Education Association (ADEA) is the voice of dental education. ADEA members are more than 16,000 students, faculty, staff, and administrators from all of the U.S. and Canadian dental schools, many allied and postdoctoral education programs, and numerous corporations working in oral health education.

Dr. Andrieu is the second ADEA president elected from the LSUHSC School of Dentistry in the past five years.

Federal judge ruling victory for city, state and region

plan all of the activities, make all of the arrangements, run the camp and volunteer as counselors.

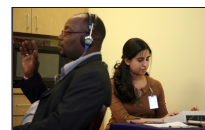
Campers have the opportunity to attend summer camp and to be just

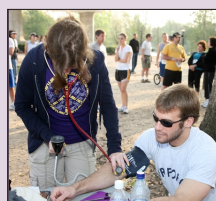
