hrough Dr. Edward Trapido, Associate Dean for Research in the LSUHSC School of Public Health. LSU Health Sciences Center New Orleans is the only university involved in the Programme of Action for Cancer Therapy (PACT), a program of the International Atomic Energy Agency, which is part of the UN System of Agencies. Collaborating with the World Health Organization, PACT has worked to develop comprehensive cancer control programs in lowresource settings in countries around the world.

The PACT leadership asked Dr. Trapido to lead the evaluation of the programs he helped to design in each of the UN's seven regions when he was working for the National Cancer Institute. With her experience in cancer control and program evaluation in Louisiana, Dr. Williams also served as a valuable resource.

Children's Health Study awarded to RTI/LSUHSC Academic Consortium

he Centers for Disease Control awarded the contract for the eight-year, four-state Children's Health Study to the RTI/LSUHSC Academic



Consortium. The study will investigate the health outcomes of living in FEMA-temporary housing units after Katrina and Rita. This \$1 million per year contract for LSUHSC will begin with a two-year pilot study. Dr. James Diaz, Professor of Public Health and Director of Environmental/Occupational Health Sciences, will serve as the P.I. and Medical Director. LSUHSC

will lead local efforts to coordinate community-based mobile medical units and clinical assessments and provide clinical laboratory support to analyze samples and medical records.


