UMC Board given preliminary financing ok

The financial consultants who have been working on the new hospital told the



University Medical Center Board at its last meeting that the state should be able to borrow the \$400 million necessary to complete construction of the hospital.



The team is working to complete the application for federal mortgage insurance from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development—the gold standard for public hospital debt which will help attract investors to buy the bonds that would be paid back with hospital revenues.

Also on track is the groundbreaking being planned



for the end of this month. Details will be made available as soon as they are confirmed.
