## Dental School awards professorships

## 60% of LSUHSC medical graduates chose to remain in LA

One hundred four of 178 LSUHSC graduating medical students participating in the National Resident Match Program chose to remain in Louisiana to complete their medical training. That's about 60% of the class, as high as last year. The LSU Health Sciences Center New Orleans residency programs also did very well accepting 132 new residents who will begin their programs next summer.

The percentage of LSUHSC medical graduates going into primary care is 44% this year. Primary Care specialties included are Family Practice, Internal Medicine, Medicine-Preliminary, Obstetrics-Gynecology, Pediatrics, and Medicine-Pediatrics. Our very successful Rural Physicians Program is addressing the need for greater numbers of primary care physicians for our state
