



Download 2 citations.
Create File

1. Perform a search and mark the references you want to export.
2. Click **Send To** menu.
3. Under **Choose Destination** select **Citation Manager**.
4. Save resulting file (citation.nbib) to your computer

5. Log in to **RefWorks**.
6. Select **References -> Import** from the toolbar – a box will appear.

7. Select **NLM PubMed** as the data source and as the database.
8. **Browse** to find the text file you saved to your computer.
9. Click **Import**.
10. Records will appear in the **Last Imported Folder** in RefWorks
