Downtown campus:

- During the heavy rains on Wednesday, November 25th, the CSRB had water intrusion from the top floor due to construction and an area that was not sealed off properly. Water came in from the ceiling during the rain. The 6th floor was badly affected and other floors were modestly affected. Repairs will start after moisture has dissipated.
- Over the holidays there will be an AC outage for all downtown buildings December 28th 30th to tie in new pumping equipment for the central plant. They will be working 24 hours a day to complete that project.
- Saturday, December 12th, they will be working on the bridge caps and electrical wiring on the top of the walkway between Nursing and MEB.
- Lions 2nd floor renovations to accommodate standby power will be started in the beginning of the new year.
- Construction on walkway from UMC over Tulane Ave. will start soon. There will be an elevator and stairs located at the corner of S. Prieur St. and Tulane Ave., and the new walkway will connect to the existing one at the corner of S. Prieur St. and Gravier St. There will not be a connection to the HDC.
- Construction on walkway from CSRB to MEB will not be complete for another year.
- MEB 1st floor construction is being handled in small phases and will continue over the holiday break
- New student housing construction has started. Project is estimated to take 18 months.
- "Percent for Art" art received for the HDC.
- 1542 Tulane Ave. construction and outage on December 29th and in early January.
- North side of CSRB will be getting new ac. The south side is complete.

• Interim LSU Hospital site (formerly University Hospital, formerly Hotel Dieu) is now referred to as Center for Advanced Learning and Simulation (CALS) and construction continues.

Dental campus:

- Digital Dentistry Lab is complete
- New locker rooms for students is complete
- New office and conference room are complete
