6	FACULTY SENATE CONSTITUTION
7	Preamble
8	The faculty of the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New
9	Orleans (LSUHSC-NO), within applicable laws and policies of the Chancellor of the
10	LSUHSC-NO, the President of the LSU System, and the Board of Supervisors of the
11	Louisiana State University and A & M College, do hereby effect through this
12	Constitution the Faculty Senate of the LSUHSC-NO.
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14	Article I. Name.
15	Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Faculty Senate of the LSUHSC-NO,
16	hereinafter referred to as the Senate.
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18	Article II. Purpose.
19	Section 1. To serve as a representative voice of the faculty.
20	Section 2. To provide a means of communication between the faculty and the Chancellor
21	and the Administration staff of the LSUHSC-NO.
22	A. The Faculty Senate, subject to the powers vested in the Chancellor of
23	LSUHSC-NO, shall:
24	(i) consider and make recommendations concerning all matters of general
25	interest, as distinguished from those affecting a single school;
26	(ii) review and approve all changes in existing policies or the
27	establishment of new policies relating to matters of general LSUHSC-NO
28	interest when these policies are brought to the Senate for consideration by
29	the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO or by its own members or constituencies;
30	(iii) consider and make recommendations on any matters referred to it by
31	the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO or by its own members or constituencies.
32	B. Any recognized group within the LSUHSC-NO community shall possess the
33	privilege of presenting suggestions or raising problems for consideration
34	by the Faculty Senate or by any of the standing committees of the Senate.
35	The "LSUHSC-NO community" shall mean those eligible for membership
36	in the Senate as individuals, as well as, groups whose members are all
37	eligible for membership in the Senate.
38	Section 3. To accept and share responsibility with administration and students in all
39	efforts to improve the stature and to accomplish the mission of the Louisiana State
40	University Health Sciences Center-New Orleans.
41	Section 4. To communicate with the faculty assemblies of the Schools of Medicine,
42	Dentistry, Nursing, Allied Health Sciences, Graduate Studies and Public Health at

Section 5. To communicate with the faculty senates of the other colleges and universities within the State of Louisiana. 45 46

LSUHSC-NO.

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47	Article III. Jurisdiction.
48	Section 1. The Senate may hear, consider, and advise the Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO
49	and his administration on any matter of concern.
50	Section 2. The Senate, upon its request, may be furnished by the Chancellor of the
51	LSUHSC-NO information appropriate to its consideration in such a matter.
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53	Article IV. Membership and Term of Office.
54	Section 1. Members of the Senate shall be selected/elected by the respective Faculty
55	Organizations by whatever procedure they approve, provided that such procedure
56	yields Delegates who comply with faculty representation as set forth in this
57	Constitution and Bylaws.
58	Section 2. For purposes of selecting Senators, eligible faculty are those full-time faculty
59	with academic rank of Instructor or above as defined by the schools, excluding
60	those administrators, deans, department heads, and any others whose functions are
61	primarily administrative.
62	Section 3. Membership in the Senate shall be determined by proportional representation,
63	in accordance with the formula provided in the Bylaws.
64	Section 4. A Senator may be recalled, as determined by the respective Faculty
65	Organization bylaws.
66	Section 5. The term of office of a Senator shall be three academic years, commencing at
67	the first Senate meeting following his/her election.
68	Section 6. Senators are eligible to serve no more than two consecutive terms. [Senators
69	elected to an initial one or two-year partial terms shall be eligible to succeed
70	themselves at the conclusion of their initial term for one additional term.]
71	Section 7. Approximately one-third of the members of the Senate shall be elected each
72	year. The terms of office shall be staggered.
73	Section 8. The Senate shall be the sole judge of the qualifications of its members and
74	shall have the power to review any contested election.
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76	Article V. Meetings.
77	Section 1. The Senate shall meet in regular monthly sessions.
78	Section 2. Special meetings of the Senate may be called as stipulated in the Bylaws.
79	Section 3. Rules governing the conduct of regular and special meetings shall be as
80	stipulated in the Bylaws.
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82	Article VI. Officers.
83	Section 1. All officers of the Senate shall be elected members of the Senate.
84	Section 2. Officers of the Senate shall be the President, the President-elect, the Secretary,
85	an elected Faculty Representative (see Article VIII, section 2), and an Alternate
86	Faculty Representative.
87	Section 3. The officers of the Senate shall be elected in accordance with the Bylaws.
88	Section 4. The officers of the Senate shall discharge their duties as stipulated in the
89	Bylaws.
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91	Article VII Executive Committee

Section 1. The Executive Committee of the Senate shall consist of the President, the Past 92 93 President (ex-officio), President-elect, Secretary, and the Faculty Representatives 94 to the LSU System. Section 2. The duties and responsibilities of the Executive Committee shall be as 95 stipulated in the Bylaws. 96 97 Article VIII. Elections. 98 Section 1. Members of the Senate shall be selected during the first half of June of each 99 year by such means as the respective faculty assemblies vote to approve. 100 Section 2. Officers of the Senate shall be elected by secret ballot at the June meeting of 101 102 the Faculty Senate as the first order of business. Section 3. Two Faculty Representatives to the LSU System will be elected by the Senate 103 to serve two-year terms (with their terms staggered if possible). The 104 Representatives may be a senator or a past senator, but should by definition be 105 eligible for election to their respective faculty assemblies. The maximum service 106 period of the Representatives shall be two consecutive terms. It is encouraged 107 that these offices of the Senate will rotate among the various Schools representing 108 LSUHSC-NO. 109 Section 4. If a senator in the second year of their current term is elected to the office of 110 President-elect, then the term of that senator shall be extended to include a 4th 111 year during which they, as President, will serve as member-at-large. When the 112 President becomes a member at large, his/her original senate seat will become 113 vacant, at which time the respective faculty assembly will elect a new senator to 114 serve a 3-year term as stipulated in the By-Laws. Should the President-elect 115 senator be re-elected to a second 3-year term in the Senate by their respective 116 faculty assembly, that senator will serve as President during the first year of their 117 second term and the term will not be extended beyond 3 years. 118 119 Article IX. Committees. 120 Section 1. The standing committees of the Senate shall be: 121 A. Professional Rights, Responsibilities and Faculty Welfare Committee 122 B. Research Committee 123 124 C. Clinical Education, Service, and Patient Care Committee D. Constitution, Bylaws, Resolutions, Nominations and Elections Committee 125 E. Facilities, Safety, and Security Committee 126 F. Electronic Communication Committee 127 Section 2. Standing committees shall: 128 A. Formulate and recommend actions and policies for approval by the Senate. 129 130 B. Be available to consult and advise the Chancellor and Administration of the LSUHSC-NO. 131 C. Study matters assigned to them by the Senate or the Executive Committee, and 132 133 consider written requests of faculty. D. Seek factual information and the opinions of interested parties prior to any 134 final action on a matter, and 135 136 E. Report to the Senate at each regular meeting.

137	Section 3. The functions of the standing committees of the Senate shall be as stipulated in
138	the Bylaws.
139	Section 4. Ad Hoc committees of the Senate may be appointed by the President of the
140	Senate or Chancellor to deal with specific issues as they arise.
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142	Article X. Amendments.
143	Section 1. Any proposal to amend, alter, or repeal the provisions of this Constitution shall
144	be initially supported by a simple majority vote of the Senate.
145	Section 2. Any such proposal shall be made at least one regular meeting preceding that at
146	which the vote on ratification is taken.
147	Section 3. Proposed amendments shall require ratification by a two-thirds vote of the total
148	Senate.
149	Section 4. The procedure for amendments shall be as stipulated in the Bylaws.
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151	Article XI. Interpretation.
152	Provisions of this Constitution and Bylaws, whenever unclear, ambiguous, or
153	indefinite, shall be subject to interpretation by a simple majority vote of the total Faculty
154	Senate.

155	LSU Health Sciences Center in New Orleans
156	FACULTY SENATE BYLAWS
157	Article I. Membership.
158	Section 1. Eligibility. Members of the Senate shall be elected from the LSUHSC-NO
159	General Faculty as defined in Article IV of the Constitution.
160	Section 2. Formula for Representation. The Senate shall consist of a total number of
161	28 members as determined by the following formula; there shall be:
162	A. There will be eight senators from the LSUHSC-NO Faculty Assembly of
163	the School of Medicine, the majority of whom must be from clinical
164	departments. Five senators will be elected by each of the Faculty
165	Organizations of the LSUHSC-NO Schools of Nursing, Allied Health
166	Professions, and Dentistry in New Orleans. Two senators will be elected
167	by the LSUHSC-NO Schools of Graduate Studies and Public Health in
168	New Orleans. One senator will also be elected from the LSUHSC-NO
169	library faculty.
170	Section 3. Vacancies. In case of resignation, incapacity, change of status, or irregular
171	attendance of any Senator, the respective Faculty Organization shall be
172	responsible for naming a replacement to serve the term remaining. Irregular
173	attendance shall be defined as failure to attend at least one-half of the regular
174	Senate meetings during any one six-month period.
175	Section 4. Proxy Voting. Any member of the Faculty Senate may designate a member of
176	the full-time faculty from his/her Faculty Organization to serve as his/her
177	alternate at any specific meeting of the Faculty Senate; provided, however, no
178	person may be designated an alternate for more than one absent elected senator
179	and no elected senator may serve as his/her alternate. To designate an alternate a
180	member of the Senate shall execute a proxy form specifying the name of the
181	alternate, the meeting for which the alternate shall represent the absent senator,
182	and certifying that the named alternate is a full-time member of the Faculty
183	Organization. The executed alternate form may be presented to the Secretary
184	prior to roll call or mailed to the Secretary at his/her faculty box at least one
185	week prior to a scheduled meeting.
186	Section 5. Meetings. The President will select a location for meetings of the full Senate.
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188	Article II. Officers.
189	Section 1. Duties of Officers.
190	1. The President shall
191	A. Preside at meetings of the Executive Committee,
192	B. Select the place of meeting of the Senate and notify Senators of any
193	change in regularly designated times and places,
194	C. Preside at meetings of the Senate,
195	D. Appoint the members to the standing committees of the Senate
196	E. Assign each new proposal and/or matter to the appropriate committee
197	of the Senate,
198	F. Be a voting member of the Senate,
199	G. Inform any constituency when it is necessary for it to fill a vacancy in
200	its representation in the Senate,

201	H. State clearly each issue being voted on before the vote is taken and
202	announce to the Senate the results of the vote,
203	I. Appoint a member of the Senate to keep records of any meeting from
204	which the Secretary is absent,
205	J. Appoint ad hoc committees of the Senate subject to the approval of the
206	Executive Committee,
207	K. Transmit to the Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO all recommendations
208	approved by the Senate,
209	L. Serve as a non-voting member of the Executive Committee for one year
210	following the expiration of his/her term of office.
211	M. Serve or appoint one designate to represent the Senate on the
212	Association of Louisiana Faculty Senates.
213	N. Serve or appoint a designate to represent the senate at the Conference
214	of La. Colleges and Universities.
215	O. Serve as an ex-officio member of the Chancellor's Executive
216	Committee.
217	2. The President-elect shall:
218	A. Serve as a member of the Executive Committee,B. Assume, in the absence of the President, the duties of the President, and
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220	C. Become the President should the position become vacant.D. Assume the office of President at the conclusion of the term of the
221	current President.
222223	3. The Secretary shall
224	A. Serve as a member of the Executive Committee,
225	B. Keep clear and accurate records of the transactions of the Senate,
226	C. Be responsible for reproducing and distributing minutes of each
227	meeting of the Senate to the Chancellor, Administration and General
228	Faculty within one week after each meeting,
229	D. Deposit a duplicate of these records and other papers of the Senate in
230	the LSU Health Sciences Center-New Orleans Library within one
231	month after each meeting (Medical and Dental libraries).
232	E. Keep an up-to-date compilation of all Senate Resolutions and the
233	Chancellor's responses to these resolutions,
234	F. Preside, in the absence of the President and President-elect, at meetings
235	of the Senate long enough to allow for the election of a temporary
236	chairperson for that meeting,
237	G. Carry on any necessary correspondence of the Senate,
238	H. Tabulate and record the results of all votes of the Senate,
239	I. Keep a current list of the members of the Senate,
240	J. Record the names of the members present at each meeting of the Senate
241	and inform the President when excessive absences occur,
242	K. Provide an agenda for the Senate meetings one week before the
243	meeting
244	L. Keep clear and concise minutes of the meetings of the Executive
245	Committee.
246	4. The Faculty Representatives shall:

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A. Report to the Senate on issues being considered by the Board of 247 Supervisors particularly those that will have an effect on LSUHSC-248 249 B. Serve as the faculty's representative to the LSU System Council of 250 Faculty Advisors. 251 C. Provide this information in summary form so that it can be 252 disseminated to the presiding officers of each Faculty Assembly of 253 the Health Science Center. 254 Section 2. **Term of Office.** The term of office for the senate President and President-elect 255 shall be for one twelve (12) month period, running from July 1, (beginning of the 256 school fiscal year following the June election). The Secretary and Faculty 257 Representatives may serve two consecutive terms. 258 259 Article III. Executive Committee. 260 Section 1. Meetings. The Executive Committee shall confer prior to each regular 261 meeting of the Senate and prepare an agenda for that meeting. 262 Section 2. **Duties.** The Executive Committee shall 263 A. Make certain that any proposal submitted by a Senator shall be considered 264 by the Senate, 265 B. Distribute an agenda to all Senators at least five days prior to all regular 266 meetings of the Senate, and 267 C. Prepare a yearly calendar of meetings of the Senate, stipulating the 268 deadlines for submitting proposals to be included in the agendas. 269 270 Article IV. Elections. 271 Section 1. **Election of Officers.** The Nominations and Elections Committee shall at the 272 May meeting of the Senate, submit at least one name for each office of the 273 Senate except for the office of President, and thereafter other nominations may 274 be called for from the floor. The vote for Officers of the Senate shall be taken at 275 the June meeting of the Faculty Senate in accordance with Article VIII Section 2 276 of the Constitution. 277 278 279 Article V. Committees. 280 Section 1. Formation. In accordance with Article II Section 1 Subparagraphs D and J of the Bylaws, the President of the Senate shall appoint members to all standing and 281 ad hoc committees of the Senate. A Senator shall not be a member of more than 282 one standing committee of the Senate. Each standing and ad hoc committee of 283 the Senate shall have the authority to appoint non-Senate members of the 284 285 LSUHSC-NO General Faculty to serve on its committee. The Senate President will appoint the chairperson of each committee of the Senate from among the 286 Senate members of the committee. 287 Section 2. Standing Committees of the Senate. 288 A. Professional Rights, Responsibilities, and Faculty Welfare Committee 289 of the Senate shall consider, make recommendations on, and report to the 290 291 Senate on matters pertaining to academic freedom, academic fairness, and professional ethics in any area appropriate to its purview. It shall also 292

consider, make recommendations on, and report to the Senate on matters pertaining to faculty welfare, benefits, and programs in any area appropriate to its purview.

- B. **Research Committee** of the Senate shall consider, make recommendations on, and report to the Senate on matters pertaining to LSUHSC-NO research studies (clinical, applied, and basic science), space, funding and programs in any area appropriate to its purview.
- C. Clinical Education, Service, and Patient Care Committee of the Senate shall consider, make recommendations on, and report to the Senate on matters pertaining to LSUHSC-NO clinical education, service, patient care and programs in any area appropriate to its purview.
- D. Constitution, Bylaws, Resolutions, Nominations and Elections
 Committee of the Senate shall consider and recommend to the Senate resolutions concerning matters of general interest to LSUHSC-NO faculty. It shall further consider, make recommendations on, and report to the Senate on matters pertaining to the amendment of the Constitution and Bylaws. It shall also organize a subcommittee of Senate members who are not candidates for reelection that shall propose a slate of officers for election for the upcoming year.
- E. **Facilities, Safety, and Security Committee** shall consider, make recommendations on, and report to the Senate on matters pertaining to the physical plant and safety and security of the LSU Health Sciences Center-NO.
- F. **Electronic Communications Committee** shall be responsible for maintaining information on the Faculty Senate Website.

Article VI. Meetings.

- Section 1. **Regular Meetings.** The first regular meeting of the Senate shall be held in July. Other regular meetings shall be held pursuant to Article III. Section 2, Subparagraph B.
- Section 2. **Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Senate may be called by the Secretary at the request of the President of the Senate or upon the written request of 25% of the Senators.
- Section 3. **Quorum.** A simple majority (15) of Senators, including at least one representative from each Faculty Organization shall be required to conduct business at any meeting of the Senate.
- Section 4. **Minutes.** A complete and permanent set of minutes of each meeting shall be kept by the Secretary.
- Section 5. **Guests.** Meetings of the Senate shall be open. The Senate may choose to go into executive session by a majority vote of the members present for a specific purpose allowed by law. A member of the General Faculty may "at the request of a Senator" be allowed to address the Senate for a specific purpose for no more than ten minutes. The Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO, or his/her designated representative, or any person not a member of the General Faculty may address the Senate subject to the approval of a majority of those present.

339 with Roberts' Rules of Order (Revised). Section 7. Order of Business. The order of business at Senate meetings shall be as 340 follows: 341 342 A. Call to Order B. Roll Call 343 C. Approval of Minutes 344 D. Unfinished Business 345 E. New Business 346 F. Reports of Committees of the Senate 347 G. Reports of the Faculty Representative and/or Alternate 348 H. Announcements 349 I. Adjournment 350 351 Section 8. Procedures on Proposals other than Amendments. The following procedures shall be used for all proposals to the Senate: 352 A. Proposals for consideration by the Senate must be submitted in writing to 353 the Executive Committee at least two weeks before the next scheduled 354 meeting of the Senate. This provision may be waived only if the 355 Executive Committee interprets a proposal to be an emergency. 356 B. Each new proposal shall be read to the Senate during the portion of the 357 meeting devoted to new business. 358 C. After each proposal is read, the Senate shall consider the question of 359 sending the proposal to a standing committee of the Senate. Debate on 360 the question shall be limited to five minutes for proponents and five 361 minutes for opponents. 362 D. If a majority of the Senate present approve, the President shall assign the 363 proposal to the appropriate committee of the Senate. If less than a 364 majority of the Senators present approve, the proposal shall be dropped. 365 E. At the next meeting of the Senate, the appropriate committee of the Senate 366 shall make a full report of its studies on the proposal and state any 367 alterations or objections that it feels advisable to make. 368 F. After the appropriate committee of the Senate has completed its report, the 369 370 Senate shall debate the question of adopting the proposed recommendation. Amendments may be submitted from the floor. 371 G. The failure of a committee of the Senate to make a report at its appointed 372 time shall not preclude the right of the Senate at that time to move, 373 debate, adopt, or reject the proposed recommendation or a variation of it. 374 H. A proposed recommendation shall not be adopted as a recommendation of 375 376 the Senate unless it receives the vote of a majority of the Senators present. 377 I. A minority report may be filed by a Senator(s) who does not vote with the 378 379 majority. 380 J. If the Executive Committee interprets a proposal to be an emergency, the proposal need not be referred to committee, and a recommendation may 381 382 be introduced, drafted, and adopted during the same meeting at which it was proposed. 383

Section 6. Conduct of Meetings. The conduct of Senate business shall be in accordance

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K. The Chancellor or his designate, at his discretion, may submit items to the 384 Senate for discussion and/or request to address the Senate. 385 Section 9. Voting Procedures. Voting shall be by show of hands or without objection at 386 all in-person meetings. A roll call vote is required when requested by any 387 Senator. A secret ballot requires a majority vote of the Senate. 388 389 Article VII. Amendments. 390 Section 1. Amendments to this Constitution or its Bylaws shall be made at regular 391 meetings of the Senate. 392 Section 2. The following procedure shall be used for any proposed amendment to the 393 Constitution: 394 A. To propose an amendment, a Senator must notify the Secretary of his/her 395 intentions in writing at least three weeks prior to the next regular 396 meeting. A copy of the proposal shall be included in the call for the next 397 regular meeting and a copy shall be sent to each Faculty Organization at 398 least ten days prior to the next meeting. 399 B. At the next regular meeting, the President of the Senate shall read the 400 proposal and call for preliminary debate that shall be limited to five 401 minutes for proponents and five minutes for opponents. 402 C. For the proposal to be admitted for further consideration after preliminary 403 debate it must be supported by a simple majority of the Senators present 404 or by a petition in favor of the proposal furnished by the proposer, 405 pursuant to Article X, Section I of the Constitution. Without either type 406 of support, the proposal shall die for lack of support. 407 D. Upon a proposal's being admitted for further consideration, the President of 408 the Senate shall refer the proposal to the Constitution, Bylaws, and 409 Resolutions Committee of the Senate for study. 410 E. At the next meeting of the Senate, the Committee shall make a full report 411 of its studies on the proposal and state any alterations or objections that it 412 feels advisable to make. 413 F. After the Committee has completed its report, the Senate shall debate the 414 question of adopting the proposal. Amendments to the proposal may be 415 416 submitted from the floor. G. The failure of the Committee to make its report at the appointed time shall 417 not preclude the right of the Senate at that time to move, debate, adopt, or 418 reject the proposal or a variation of it. 419 H. After debate, the proposal shall require a two-thirds vote of the total 420 membership. 421 422 Section 3. A proposed amendment to the Bylaws must receive an absolute majority vote of the Senate. 423
